

## MAC-LABELS

Thank you for your interest in these programs. The copyright notice on each program is only there to discourage sales of the program. Individuals and non profit user groups may copy, use and distribute them provided no fee of any kind is charged. Such distribution is encouraged in order that as many as possible may benefit from the work that went into them.

10LINLABEL prints up to 10 lines of text, up to 50 characters per line, on a mailing label. Text is entered in DATA statements at the end of the program. Unused lines must be represented by commas. Program can then be saved under a descriptive name for later reuse. Good for Warnings, Meeting Notices, Travel Directions, Instructions, etc. There must be 12 DATA items and the first and last must be commas for spacing between labels.

ADDR-A-TAG Prints a bordered address label with greeting similar to PRINT A TAG. Inspired by John Willforths PRINT N ID. One good revision deserves another. See FRAMEANAME and RETURNADDR. Great for mailing Valentines, Greeting Cards and Holiday Gifts.

CATALABEL will print a catalog of the disk in Drive No 1 on a mailing label. Press enter when ready. If the number of programs exceed the capacity of the label, the catalog will be continued on successive labels, as required. There are 2 programs on the disk, one for 1" x 3 1/2" labels with a capacity of 15 programs, the other for 1 1/2" x 4" labels, which can list 27 programs. CATALABEL2 file descriptors: D=DIS/FIX d=DIS/VAR I=INT/FIX i=INT/VAR.

CONSOLABEL the latest revision of the program being sold by a software distributor as public domain. Prints a mailing label with a picture of the TI console and an I LUV MY TI-99/4A message. (Also known as TIMAILABEL)

DISKLABEL a TIny GRAM, (One screenful of code), prints a Disk Label on a mailing label. Applications are only limited by your imagination. It has been used for Disk boxes, Doc binders, Bookplates, "Property of" labels, Address labels (skip first line), Name tags, Place cards, hardware bins, on loose leaf Newsletter binders and Magazine cases.

FLEXILABEL a TIny GRAM, is an all purpose label printer. Originally developed for Video Cassette labels, (They just fit the side of the cassette) it will print up to 10 lines of text on a label in expanded compressed type. Line spacing changes automatically to Superscript for more than 7 lines per label. Entering FUNCTION C(hange) during text entry enables line quantity to be changed.

FRAMEANAME A version of ADDR A TAG, it prints a Tag or Label with a solid border. No header or greeting. You can enter 3 lines of text for address or message. Makes a distinctive address label.

LOAD is a menu loader for loading the program files on this disk. As with most of the files, Extended Basic is required.

MAC-CAT Will print out a disk catalog of this disk in superscript with file

comments. Print from TI-Writer's Editor or with PRINTADOC (Option U).

MAIL-A-TAG Will print a series of address labels similar to PRINTATAG2 from a DV80 address list. Addresses should be on 3 lines. Any blank lines will be ignored. Great for Christmas card and newsletter mailings. Data Base list can first be printed to disk, and then printed with MAIL-A-TAG.

OILCHANGE for people who service their own automobiles. Prints out a service label on a mailing label for keeping track of the maintenance services performed. If your mechanic doesn't use one you can make one out and affix it yourself. A dozen of these in a small note book or on a card makes a neat maintenance log for the glove compartment. (AKA SERVICE LABEL)

PRINT-N-ID A revision of PRINTATAG2 by John Willforth of West Penn 99ers. It allows the user to input text on all lines of the label increasing its versatility. Designed for use as a name tag of the "HI! My Name Is" type for use at conventions and fairs, (Sticks to clothing without damage.), it can also be used for bordered address labels, Bookplates, ("Please Return To" followed with name and address and the "Walker" border), Place Cards, etc. Thanks to John, it's not just for gift tags anymore. You can print 1 heart in the HEADER text by keying FUNCTION T (close bracket ]) followed by a space. It will only work in the HEADER text.

PRINTADOC This program will read a DV-80 file written in 40 column format and print it in 80 column format. Use it to print this file, -READ-ME, and MAC-CAT with Menu Option U.

PRINTATAG2 latest revision of the program published in Dec 87 Micropendium. Prints a gift tag on a mailing label with a choice of border designs. It appears that this program is also being sold by a software distributor as public domain. You can print 1 heart in the GREETING text by keying FUNCTION T (close bracket ]) followed by a space. It will only work in the GREETING text. (Also works with ADDR-A-TAG.)

PRINTSTRIP latest revision of the program published in Aug 86 Micropendium. Prints command line strips of your design for your console or keyboard. Your designs can be saved to disk for future reprinting. Files on this disk beginning with an exclamation point are command strips for some of the more popular programs. Mailing labels won't work for this one.

QDBANNER appeared as a User Note in Jan 87 Micropendium. Quick and Dirty, this 9 line program will print horizontal banners with letters 8 inches high. Too bad mailing labels aren't available for this program.

RETURN ADDR A version of FRAMEANAME that allows you to enter your own name and address into Lines 330, 360 and 366. Save it so you can print return address labels with borders of your choice without having to enter the text each time.

SAVEALABEL Do you have a label that you use frequently? Enter the text into DATA statements at the end of this program and save it to disk with

a descriptive name. Up to 5 lines of text, 28 characters per line. Again, unused lines must be represented by commas. Used for relatives' address labels, User Group advertising, bookplates, your own return address labels, etc.

STATIONERY a revision of CONSOLABEL which also prints letterheads and envelopes with the I LUV MY TI-99/4A motif. Enter your name and address in the DATA statement at the end of the program.

STYLELABEL a TInyGRAM similar to FLEXI LABEL except text lines are fixed at 5 per label and one of three Type Styles can be selected, Expanded, Expanded Elite, or Expanded Compressed. You can change Type Style by Entering FUNCTION C(hange) during text entry.

TI1COLABEL prints a one color label which is a large version of TIMAILABEL without name or address. Uses mailing labels.

TI2COLABEL a version of TI1COLABEL which permits printing the Heart with a Red ribbon. Dark blue makes a nice contrast color for the lettering.

TIBIGHEART makes a miniature two color bumper sticker (or wherever) out of a mailing label. Feel free to replace the the User Group name with your own.

WARNING! If you try to roll labels back out of the printer, eventually one will peel off and get stuck under the platen. Printer repairs are more costly than a few wasted labels. Cut off the labels back of the platen and roll them out in the normal direction. If you hate to waste labels, print your return address labels on this tail piece. Another way is to slip a sheet of paper behind the labels and work it around the platen to the front so it covers the labels, then back the labels and paper out together.

The Epson printers have an adjustment for paper thickness. Labels with their backing sheet are thicker than a sheet of paper. If you are going to print more than just a few labels, you may want to adjust for the extra thickness (move lever toward front of printer on RX-80) to save wear on the print head. Don't ever use this lever to adjust for a weak ribbon. Ribbons are cheaper than print heads.

If these programs make you think we are overly partial to mailing labels, it's not really so. We just happened to buy a box of 5,000 and had to figure out some use for them. (We are now on our second box!) They are inexpensive, convenient, stick to your ribs and not just for mailing. Have fun.
